# OUR MISSION & HISTORY

Nurtury gives Greater Boston's youngest children in need, birth to age five, the opportunity to reach their full potential by investing in school readiness, promoting healthy development, and strengthening families.

When our first program opened in 1878, Nurtury became New England's first early education and care agency. Since then, Nurtury has transformed child care to include high-quality educational programming and family support resources. We also embrace a leadership role in the early education field in Boston, convening other family-support organizations, and advocating for the early education workforce at the state level.

Through our center-based programs and family child care system, we have touched generations of children and their families. Every year we care for, and educate 1,000 of Greater Boston's youngest and most vulnerable children at our early learning centers and family child care sites.



Established in 1922, the Ruggles Street/Mission Hill Day Care center became the first educational pre-school in the nation. Fifty years later, the Gilday Center was established by the Boston Junior League, its purpose to serve abused and neglected children. In 1999, a brand new, state-of-the-art facility was constructed that brought together both centers under one roof. Now known as Horadan Way, this facility currently serves infants, toddlers and preschool children.

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# PRESCHOOL CLASSROOM – BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS

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The Boston Public School preschool program is one of the strongest in the nation! Research shows children who attend BPS preschool are more prepared for kindergarten in areas of early math, reading, and social-emotional development.

All Boston children who are four years old by September 1, 2020, are eligible. The preschool program is a full six-and-a-half-hour school day at either a BPS school or a community early learning center.

Universal Pre-K is funded by \$15 million from Mayor Martin J. Walsh, who is committed to providing a high-quality education to every child in every neighborhood.



# BPS PRESCHOOL CLASSROOM AT HORADAN WAY



4 to 5 year olds

- Ratio of 2 teachers to 20 students.
- Teachers have a degree in Early Education.
- Teachers receive coaching support and professional development training from BPS.
- Follows the K1 and Building Blocks curriculum.
- Program is accredited.
- Children must be 4 by September 1.
- Families must live in Boston.
