Mission

Nurtury Early Education's mission is to give Greater Boston's youngest children in need the opportunity to reach their full potential by investing in school readiness, promoting healthy development, and strengthening families.





About Nurtury

Nurtury Early Education is a mission-driven nonprofit providing early care and education to 1,100 of Greater Boston's youngest children, including infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and their families. Nurtury currently operates three early learning centers in Boston and Cambridge and a Family Child Care (FCC) system supporting a growing network of 150 women-led, home-based small businesses throughout many Boston neighborhoods as well as Chelsea, Everett, Revere, Malden, Winthrop, and other Greater Boston communities.

At the heart of Nurtury's mission is ensuring that all children enrolled in our center-based and family child care programs benefit from high quality early care and education to promote healthy development and lifelong learning. Over 95% of the families we serve are income-eligible for Child Care Financial Assistance (CCFA) through the state's Department of Early Education & Care.

When our first program opened in 1878, Nurtury became the Commonwealth's first early education and care agency. Our dedicated educators and staff have touched generations of children and their families. Today, we embrace a leadership role in the early education sector, collaborating with fellow providers in advocacy efforts to increase public funding for early education, improve wage equity for the early education workforce, deepen support for FCC small businesses, and expand access to affordable care for children and families, especially for those from marginalized communities at the core of Nurtury's mission.

Nurtury's Family Child Care (FCC) Incubator



In June, we gathered in Roxbury for the ribbon cutting of our new Family Child Care (FCC) Incubator. This innovative program is an important step forward in early education, providing start-up space and resources for aspiring entrepreneurs to get their start in family child care.

We believe that by empowering women to open and grow their own child care businesses, we not only create more opportunities for economic independence but also address the pressing need for accessible, high-quality child care for families in our community.




FY24 Revenue


